Safety Tip: Avoid Using Your Stove as a Heater

Using your stove to heat your apartment may seem like a quick fix during colder months, but it can lead to serious hazards and costly repairs. Here are some reasons why this practice should be avoided and what alternatives you can consider:

Potential Hazards

- 1. Fire Risk: Stoves are not designed to run for extended periods as a heating source. Leaving them on for long durations can increase the risk of a fire starting in your home.
- 2. Damage to the Appliance: Prolonged use of a stove for heating purposes can burn out the igniter. This component is crucial for the stove's operation, and replacing it can be both inconvenient and expensive.
- 3. Carbon Monoxide Poisoning: Gas stoves, if used improperly, can emit dangerous levels of carbon monoxide, a colorless and odorless gas that can be deadly if inhaled in large amounts.
- 4. Increased Utility Costs: Using your stove to heat your home can lead to higher energy bills, as they are not energy-efficient for this purpose.
